Invermere Teen Wins Essay Contest -Contest winners announced-

Vancouver, BC (November 17, 2011) – Kelton Rohrick, age 13, of Invermere, was the youngest winner of the Association of BC Forest Professionals' (ABC FP's) first essay contest.

The essay contest, held during National Forest Week, invited youth between 13 and 18 to write about what the forest means to them, their communities or the province of BC. The entries demonstrated the teens' love of the forest as a place to recreate, as a home for animals and as an important contributor to the economy.

Kelton's essay discussed his love of the forest as a place to recreate and as a source of multiple wood products he and his family uses. Kelton received a \$150 prize and his essay has been published on the ABC FP's website.
