Development Services has a temporary full-time opportunity starting in March 2012 for an Environmental Control Technician. You will perform technical, inspectional, regulatory and enforcement work and assist in the development and implementation of environmental quality control programs for water quality, pollution abatement and pest control. You will perform duties relating to the inspection of; trees, construction sites, parkland and related matters including responding to public complaints and inquiries. You will be responsible for preparing and issuing permits as required by various environmental bylaws. You will examine development plans and business license applications to ensure compliance with bylaws and other requirements, and may be required to assist in responding to emergencies involving trees, pollution events or other environmental incidents.

You have considerable knowledge of the methods, procedures, equipment and instruments used in environmental quality control programs and of trends and developments in this field; considerable knowledge of related policies, regulations, standards, by-laws; and sound knowledge of the principles of chemistry, biology, ecology and physics as they apply to the work. The duties involve working independently and outside in all weather conditions, and walking over rough terrain for potentially long duration.

You have the current ability to assist a superior in the development and implementation of environmental control programs, to perform technical, inspectional, regulatory and enforcement tasks; to assist with inspections of trees; to interpret plans and examine specific aspects of development plans and business license applications for compliance to bylaws; to perform research; and to prepare technical reports and correspondence. Your work will require you to establish and maintain effective working relationships with a variety of internal and external contacts and agencies, and provide information and assistance.

You have a university degree or technical diploma in an environmental, science or related field with major courses in biology, ecology and related subjects plus related experience **OR** an equivalent combination of training and experience. A valid BC Driver's License is required.

The pay range for this PG 23 position is \$30.52 – 36.02 based on a 35-hour work week.
